## Foreword, from The Deputy Grand Superintendent

**Welcome to the September 2018 edition of the Royal Arch newsletter which marks what I am sure will be an exciting year for all of us as there will be a continuation of previous initiatives together with some new innovations**



This year has seen a number of changes in key members of the Royal Arch team. In March EComp Eddie Barlow retired after four years in office as an APGP and nine years as a RADO. Eddie has been a tremendous supporter of the Royal Arch and I am delighted that this has been recognised by his appointment as this year's First Principal of 3747 Chapter and I extend my congratulations to him and also to EComp Russell Conn a RADO in the Manchester Area who will be the Chapter's Second Principal and to Ian Hunter a RADO in the Western Area who will be the Third Principal and look forward to their Installation on the 11th October which I hope will be supported by all the members of the Chapter. If you are not already a member of this Chapter but are eligible to join then I encourage you to do so by contacting the Scribe EComp Andrew Holland at the Provincial Office. EComp Gerry Hodson has taken over from Eddie as APGP for the Southern Area where he is well known having served as a District Officer in the Craft for a number of years and most recently as the District Chairman for that Area and I am sure he will be great success.

In August EComp Len Hayes retired as the APGP for the Eastern Area. Len has served the Province in many roles over the years with great distinction, particularly as District Chairman in Manchester and for the last three years as the APGP in the Eastern

Area. We wish him a long and happy retirement in Rochdale, Cyprus and in his spiritual home of the Etihad Stadium.

Len is succeeded by EComp Paul Bowen who will be best known to you in his role as both Provincial Grand Organist and Grand Organist. Paul is a musician of national renown. He was exalted in Amphibious Chapter 258 in 1999, is a Past Principal of Ardwick Chapter 2185 and is very much looking forward to help promote the Royal Arch in the Province and in particular the Eastern Area. Paul will be invested by the ME Grand Superintendent in 3747 Chapter on the 11th October.

Also in August EComp Brian Carter indicated he would like to retire as the APGP for the Northern Area. Brian has served the Province for many years in a number of capacities most particularly as the Provincial Almoner a position he held with great distinction for 6 years and as a Deputy District Chairman. We will miss his cheerful and compassionate demeanour and wish him good health and happiness in a well-deserved retirement. Brian will be succeeded by EComp David Dunn who is returning home from his sojourn in the Western Area where he will be succeeded by EComp Kirk Mulhearn. Kirk was exalted in Concorde Deane Chapter 37 and was its First Principal in 2015. Whilst only recently involved



in the affairs of the Province he has shown a real enthusiasm for both the Craft, where he is currently the Provincial Grand Charity Steward, and the Royal Arch and I am sure he will bring to his new role his experience as an Education Liaison Officer and the flair of his role in the Showman's Guild. Kirk will be invested by the ME Grand Superintendent at the Joint Convocation to be held in Concorde Deane Chapter on Monday 8th October.

In addition to these changes EComp John Cavanagh has retired as Chairman of the Royal Arch Presentation Team after many years' service. It is impossible to overstate John's contribution to the development of the Royal Arch but we are assured that he will continue to assist the team when his duties as District Chairman in Audenshaw allow. We wish him every success in his new role. Dennis Heskett has now taken over as Chairman and we wish him every success in taking the team forward. Finally there will be one further change in the Royal Arch Cabinet with effect from November when EComp Derek Thornhill retires as the Deputy Provincial Grand Master. As a Past APGP Derek has maintained a strong interest in the Royal Arch and his wise counsel has been much appreciated by me in particular, and all members of the Royal Arch Cabinet. More than anyone Derek deserves a long and happy retirement and we extend to Derek and Joan our very best wishes for the future. As Derek's successor we extend our congratulations to John Farrington and I look forward to working with John once again.

Over the next six months there are a number of Royal Arch events which are set out later in this Newsletter. In October we will have the first meeting of Palatine Chapter in its new role as a Chapter within the Universities Scheme of UGLE/SGC. This is a collaboration between members of this Province and our good friends in West Lancashire. We expect to have a membership of about forty drawn from members of both Provinces and the Installation will be on the 22 October. We will exalt three Brethren at this meeting which will be held at the newly refurbished Manchester Masonic Centre. If anyone

You will see from the Calendar that later this year there will be two presentations of Talking Heads with others to be scheduled thereafter. The presentation has been rewritten recently and provides an interesting and entertaining introduction to the Royal Arch for craft masons. We are indebted to Len Hayes and his team of presenters, Tony Freemont, Jonathan Berg and Stephen Thomson for all their hard work in putting this presentation together. The presentation whilst worked in Lodges is performed after the Lodge has called off giving more scope for illustrating aspects of the Royal Arch. In September, October and November we will be rerunning workshops for the Lodge Royal Arch Representatives and the dates for these are set out in the Events Calendar. These will be presented by EComp Joe Glass, EComp Tony Freemont EComp Jonathan Basgerw and it is essential that all the Representatives attend so that assistance can be given to them in their important role as the first line in the recruitment process. These workshops will also be attended by either me or EComp Harvey Basger and the Area APGP. Also in November the ELRAPT will be demonstrating the Veils Ceremony in Ardwick Chapter. This used to be a ceremony which was a precursor the Ceremony of Exaltation and is of both historic and symbolic significance and as this is only worked occasionally I do recommend it to you and all those interested should contact the Scribe E of the Chapter.

In our last newsletter the Grand Superintendent referred to the preparation of a booklet setting out a synopsis of the existing and new materials which are available on the Royal Arch website and I am now pleased to report that this has been completed. At present there are about eighty presentations but others are being added on a regular basis. Some of these may be best be delivered by an experienced presenter but there are many short presentations which can be read by a member of the Chapter. I do hope that full advantage will be taken of this resource so that in the future every Chapter will have



something interesting to include on the Agenda. In addition I hope that these materials will be used by individual Companions to increase their knowledge of the Royal Arch by using them for personal study.

Since the recess the Communications Committee led by Alan Ogden have been working on the Provincial Almanac and which is now up and running in a web based format. This allows for easier navigation and updating. We are investigating the possibility of incorporating many of the features of the Companions Forum in a more user-friendly form.

Recently the Province has begun a move from its own data base system to that used by UGLE and many other Provinces. The Adelphi system provides much more information than our previous system and enables us to see how the Craft and the Royal Arch our progressing over a particular period. I can therefore report that the downward trend in members, memberships and exaltations has been very much reduced over the last three years and

exaltations are now on the increase so that in the last three years they are averaging 52 a year which takes us up to the levels of six years ago. Further losses of members and memberships are lower than they have been for ten years. This all bodes well for the future of the Order.

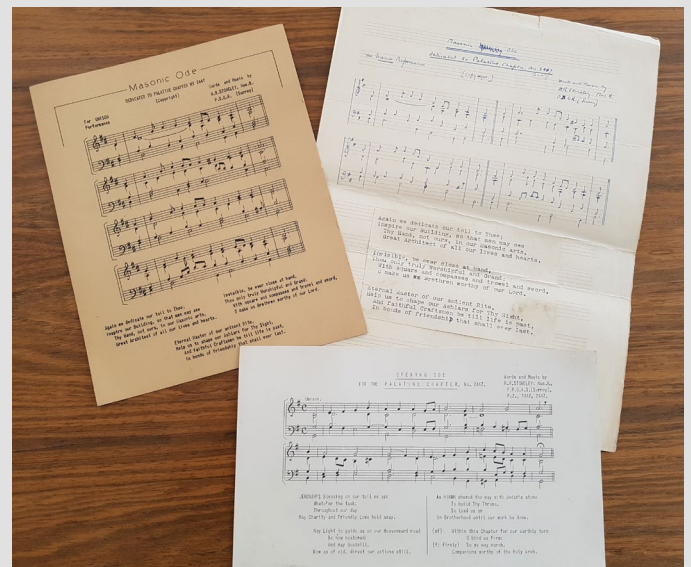

## PERFECT TIMING

In October this year Palatine Chapter will become part of the UGLE Universities Scheme and an amazing coincidence just occurred, the timing of which couldn't be better. The Chapter was contacted by a Mrs Elisabeth Miles who informed us that she had recently found some manuscripts of her late grandfather's, Comp Henry Robert Stoneley, that she felt would be of great interest to us. Comp Stoneley, was a Bachelor of Music and Organist. He was a member of the Chapter until his death in 1951 and wrote the music and words for the two pieces of works that Mrs Miles sent in. One entitled 'Opening Ode for the Palatine Chapter No 2447' and the other 'Masonic Ode dedicated to Palatine Chapter No 2447', this one included the original working sheet. She seemed to have 'made a discovery of great importance'!

These works form an extraordinary part of the history of the Chapter which is now entering a completely new phase of its life since it was consecrated in

# A step up for Gerry

When considering this newsletter it was thought that we should add a piece regarding the new Assistant to The Provincial Grand Principals (APGP) Gerry Hodson. As Paul Rose has already mentioned, there have been some considerable changes in the Province and particularly the APGP's, so Gerry is no longer the new APGP.

However, he really should be featured regardless. Future newsletters will feature the incoming APGP's.

Gerry was first initiated into Good Companions Lodge No.6005 on 8th December 1993 at Freemasons Hall, Bridge Street, Manchester. He was installed as the Worshipful Master in 1999.

He wasted little time in joining the Royal Arch being exalted into Unanimity Chapter No. 4130 on 27th February 1995, again at Bridge Street. He was installed as First Principal in 2004 serving in that role until 2006.

His Royal Arch and Craft careers ran together. Gerry became a Provincial Grand Steward in 2005 and would go on to become the Provincial Junior Grand Warden in 2014. His first Royal Arch Provincial appointment was that of Assistant Director of Ceremonies in 2006. In 2009 he was promoted to Deputy Director of Ceremonies.

Of this time Gerry says, "My first Royal Arch appointment in Province was as an ADC which I held for 3 years learning the ropes from members of the Provincial DC's team.

I was then promoted to Deputy DC and spent 5 amazing years working with some excellent Royal Arch Masons not just enjoying myself, but hopefully putting a smile on the faces of the celebrants and colleagues. I class this as one of my happiest times in Masonry which gave me a chance to put something back".

Gerry was then promoted, in 2014, to Past Provincial Grand Scribe Nehemiah.

He served the Royal Arch and the Craft on the



Audenshaw District team being the District Chairman from 2013 to 2018. In 2018 Gerry was invited and delighted to accept the role of APGP for the Southern area.

Gerry states, "I have always loved my Royal Arch Masonry through observation, participation and involvement. I love the happy and relaxed atmosphere and in my new role as APGP I will be encouraging as many Craft members that I can to join or even re-join this excellent order."

Gerry is a member of Good Companions of Commemoration Chapter No 6005 of which he was First Principal in 2009 and 2010 and a member of East Lancashire Provincial Grand Officers Chapter No 3747.

He is a Past Assistant Grand Director of Ceremonies in the United Grand Lodge of England. When not conducting his Masonic duties he plays Golf, loves football and his caravan and his on-going and most important duties of babysitter for his grandchildren, Oliver, Ava and Stanley.
